DESCRIPTION OF PRESENTATION

We will encourage to go for proportionality.

KEY THEMES

Helen Roy told the hearing that she valued both local representation and proportionality. She explained that she would like a more eclectic range of choices at the polls, and spoke in favour of the mixed member proportional (MMP) electoral system. Mrs Roy encouraged the Assembly to publicize its findings. She argued that the need for electoral reform is urgent and stated that she would like to see a new electoral system in operation in less than five years. Mrs Roy also advised that any new system recommended by the assembly may require expansion, moderation or change after it has been adopted in British Columbia. For this reason, she recommended the creation of a permanent, watchdog committee to monitor, assess and accept citizen input, in order to fine tune any new electoral systems to the unique requirements of British Columbia. This should be a non-partisan, independent, Citizens' Committee with a clear mandate and powers.

Doug Roy also agreed that it was important for an electoral system to combine both local representation and greater proportionality. He told the hearing that he fully supports the MMP system as practiced in New Zealand and Germany.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Helen and Doug Roy recommended the introduction of MMP in British Columbia.

Helen Roy also recommended the creation of a Citizens' Committee to monitor, review and adjust any new electoral system introduced.

Quote: "Electoral reform is urgent. Today we are rushing to dictatorship because of indifference, lack of community courage, hopelessness and ignorance."
