DESCRIPTION OF PRESENTATION

Youth vote: why its diminishing, and what youth want tot see in order to begin to participate.

KEY THEMES

Vine Madder was not able to attend the hearing, but her presentation was read to the hearing by the facilitator. The presentation outlined her concern with the state of the culture of the Canadian electoral system and the disproportionality of the last election result in BC. Ms Madder advocated the Mixed Member Proportional system as proposed by the Free Your Vote campaign, where a party must win five per cent of the vote to win party status. She argued that even though the system may not be perfect and is slightly more complicated, the end result is a better reflection of the views of voters than the current system.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Vine Madder recommended the introduction of MMP in British Columbia.

Quote: 'It is time for BC to set the example for all of Canada and join the ranks of democracies that strive to give every voice a chance to be heard."
