DESCRIPTION OF PRESENTATION

A presentation in support of a fairer system of representation where all voters have a voice. I believe that a huge government majority is not a good government.

KEY THEMES

Mr. Knapp outlined the lack of representation that he experienced living in Alberta and the dominance of the governing party under the current FPTP system. The presenter went on to note the problem with disproportionality under FPTP and the production of artificial and exaggerated majorities.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Mr. Knapp recommended a system of proportional representation.

Quote: I think electoral reform is a very important thing, and the most important thing is to get out and talk to your neighbours.
