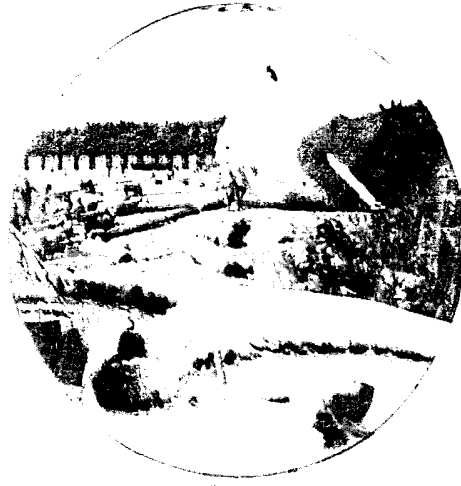


Citizens' Assembly On Electoral Reform



The Kaufmann Presentation

June, 2004 A.D.

I *My Fellow Citizens:*

I, Louis Kaufmann, Swiss-Canadian Citizen, of 17707, 16th Avenue, County Surrey/White Rock, attended your Public Hearing at the Aston Pacific Inn on May 8/04, 1420 hours, to introduce seven steps towards creating a Free Enterprise Citizen-Directed Democracy, which will include the implementation of necessary technology to provide Permanent Polling Centres in each County across our great nation.

Exhibit A is "White Rock County Citizens' News" of January 1998-Newsletter #1 - The Kaufmann Report, on the history and definition of Canadian Democratic Free Enterprise vs. Socialist Government Bureaucracy - Observations, Conclusions and Proposal for change, submitted to the City of White Rock for consideration.

II Since the 20 minutes allotted was inadequate, the Chairman of the Hearing advised that I could make a follow-up submission in writing, that would be made available to the Citizens' Assembly and on their website, and for citizens' access.

III EARLY HISTORY During the Classical Age, 500 B.C. the Greeks first practiced Democracy, among the mature, literate and educated citizens of Athens. The common rabble were excluded for good reason. In 1300 A.D. the Swiss Federation gained independence from the Hapsburg (Austrian) Empire, and began a Democratic Citizen-Directed Free Enterprise Government to this day. The paternal master of the house voted for the family, and also participated in the judicial and administrative affairs of the Canton, free of the need for Socialist Government Bureaucracy that is bankrupting our nation and leaving its citizens impoverished.

IV Canadian Historical Records showing settlers from continental Europe migrated and settled in Western Canada and the U.S.A. is reflected in "The Fields of Prosperity" a History of Engelfeld Saskatchewan 1903-1987. The Depression of the thirties did not

greatly affect the ingenious European farmer, who was capable of producing virtually every necessity to life, except for salt and bullets; many people (hobos, as they were called then), came to the farms for food and a place to sleep. The farmers always obliged and received a helping hand in return. In spite of 50 years of Colonialism and 100 years the British Monarchy vs. the French settlers; and Growth of Socialist Government Bureaucracy, Western citizens prospered and developed a quality of life by every one pitching in.

V **In the meantime, our good neighbors** to the South began buying up most of the Canadian Enterprises in Western Canada using our nation's own money, and five years before the Crash, they began pulling out their money from Canada. (See page 207 Fields of Prosperity) Ref: "How they sold our Canada to the U.S.A." by Andrew Lamerie – 1963 – Northern Book House. The Depression hit B.C. five years before the crash. One must ask: "How could this happen?" **How did Johnny Canuck become the feed trough for Uncle Sam and required to bend his knee to his call?**

Two events in history occurred;

- 1 **The French Revolution only succeeded in France.**
- 2 When the Americans were chasing the British through the brambles bushes where the rabbits wouldn't go, **they stopped at the 49th Parallel!**

VI **The Second World War** took many farmers' sons away, either to never return from the war, or to return changed men with different ambitions and destinies. Many farmers' sons joined the military more for the adventure it would bring than patriotic duty. After the War, many never returned. It was common knowledge that if a farm boy did not step into his father's footsteps and he did not go to University, he could join the priesthood, the R.C.M.P., the Air Force, or he could "go West". Such was the case with the Kaufmann boys. I returned to complete High School at St. Peter's College, Muenster, Sask in '51/'52. I then worked as a choker man and back rigger on Vancouver Island, and encountered my 1st Corporate Porkchopper, a salesman selling life insurance to the woodworkers. I asked why would you spend your hard earned money on life insurance. A man by the name of Harcourt with Great West Life said "You may die", but it doesn't cost a nickel to die said I. I took my 1st year University 101 at King Ed in Vancouver in '52/'53 and applied for a job with Canada Customs and encountered my 1st Socialist government Porkchopper, who advised that these positions are filled by British subjects. I asked what they are subject to. Answer: To the Queen of England. But I am Swiss and this is Canada.

VII **June 1954 – I began working on the Waterfront** in the Port of Vancouver as a stevedore. My work on the dock provided an opportunity to meet people from all over the world, and while the flower children were busy creating a new culture, I attended a night school course offered by U.B.C. and studied Economic reasoning and the Role that Democracy should play in a Free Enterprise Society. I then accepted a request by my fellow production working citizens to consider participating in the activities of the Union-Management in the Longshore Industry “in an attempt to create some medium for the maintenance of Justice in a scene where workers are being subtly maneuvered by professional knaves.” I encountered many Government, Corporate, Union, communist, Socialist and International Porkchoppers since. I have calculated that for each production working citizen in our nation, there are 100 Porkchoppers drawing from the Porkbarrel.

Exhibit G is a copy of the Vancouver Sun page six dated Thurs. Sept 2, 1971.

VIII **All Porkchoppers gravitate to the Ottawa Porkbarrel.** All the revenue generated in the Port of Vancouver was sent to Ottawa; and instead of building a proper freeway, truck and railway routes between Canada/U.S.A. truck crossing, the money was spent in Eastern Canada. Transport trucks to this day, arrive at the Canadian border and are required to rumble through the residential roads of South Surrey to reach the 401 to Vancouver and beyond, with the exception of Expo '86 that prompted Canadian Porkchoppers to widen 32 blocks of 176 Street from the U.S. border, nothing has been done to date and many people and animals have been killed and crippled by traffic accidents. Shortly thereafter, Welfare Offices appeared in every county across our nation busy handing out working citizens' hard earned tax money to the common rabble who choose not to work. Historically the number of people in any society who chose to live without working, averaged approx. 10% (Hobos they were called then.) When the Socialists in Ottawa and B.C. began handing out approx \$1000 each per month, this group exceeded 25% of the population. The Swiss say, “Nation that goes into debt to pay citizens to lie on back, goes belly up.” Please refer to the Kaufmann Report of 1998, page 3 – last paragraph.

XI **THIS IS THE FIRST TIME IN HISTORY THAT CITIZENS ARE BEING ASKED HOW TO IMPROVE DEMOCRACY.** It is unforunate that our present Provincial Government did not put out a call to all of the counties in the Province – to each participate collectively, rather than pick at random, two from each Electoral District to try to patch up the existing structure of balloting.

With regard to redistribution of Electoral Districts;

The guiding principle "One man, one vote"- majority of ballots cast, run-off if necessary.

I PROPOSE THAT THIS COMMITTEE INSTEAD CONSIDER AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS NOT ONLY TO THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT, BUT TO THE CITIZENS OF CANADA; ON THE FOLLOWING STEPS TO BE TAKEN TO CREATE A CITIZEN-DIRECTED DEMOCRACY.

Place on the Federal Election Ballot the following proposal:

STEP 1 Are you in favor of placing a moratorium on the Federal Government for ten years and the Provinces and Territories continue to govern themselves as independent states in a Confederation of Canada YES / NO

The states would collectively be responsible for foreign policy – interstate relationship and reduce Government Bureaucracy under direct control of a Citizen-directed Democracy

STEP 2 Are you in favor of setting up a committee of citizens committed to the principle of introducing the necessary changes to our Laws to provide for the economic democratic control of each county by the citizens YES / NO

STEP 3 Are you in favor of your county drafting a Constitution and By-Laws governing your county to replace the present Municipal Act and By-Laws to be voted on

by the citizens to provide that the highest legislative body in your county shall be the citizens YES / NO

STEP 4 Are you in favor of removing the present process of the collection of citizens' tax money from the Federal and Provincial Governments and placing it in the County Bank under County control. YES / NO

Any future monies spent on managing government shall be under the scrutiny of the Citizens paying the bill.

STEP 5 Are you in favor of adopting the Universal Principle of Voluntary Integration and Autonomous County participation to obtain citizen control of our nation's Legislation, Judicial and Administration affairs in our great land. YES / NO

STEP 6 Based on the premise that there are no people in high places; and the sum total of citizens in any society have greater wisdom than those who set themselves up and claim to represent them; are you in favor of the introduction of the necessary technology to provide permanent polling centres in each country to facilitate direct Democracy. YES / NO

STEP 7 Are you in favor (that in the event any state resorts to *the use of force to impose their will*) a 50-year-and-over requirement be made to join the armed forces. This measure would guarantee peace and unity. "Adopt the universal principle that good behavior is obtained by education and persuasion, rather than by force." Ordinary citizens do not start wars. YES / NO

PROCEDURE

1. In order for your committee to consider recommending these seven steps to improving Democracy to the Citizens of Canada; and
2. For the Citizens of Canada to vote in favor of these changes; it is necessary to address both the immediate changes that will take place and also the long term housekeeping details necessary to maintain stability during the period of transition.
3. In the event the citizens of Canada vote in favor of these changes it is necessary for the presently elected members of the three levels of Government to meet and work out the details and orderly timing of the transition of Legislative powers to the Counties in this great nation and the orderly transfer of Administrative and Judicial Authority to the Provinces and Territories.
4. Based on the adoption of the Universal Principle that good behavior is obtained by education and persuasion, rather than by force, and that adoption

of the principle of voluntary integration and autonomous County participation, whereby every eligible citizens in every County across this great nation can exercise equal say in determining the future direction of our county, state, or nation; all parties can conduct an orderly and peaceful dialogue for the transfer of the collection of tax income from the Federal and Provincial Governments to be placed in the County Banks, under County control. Any future monies spent on managing government will be under the direct scrutiny of the citizens paying the bill.

5. All Counties (communities) will be invited to set up a Constitution structure of their choice, to obtain citizen control of our nation's Legislative, Judicial and Administrative affairs in our Great Nation. (I shall undertake to draft a sample Constitution that may be suitable for use.)
6. The Premiers and Representatives of the Territories and Native Indians shall speak for the Confederation of Canada.
7. The Senate and Heads of Federal Bureaucracies will be retired under the provisions of the Canada and Old Age Laws; and since,
8. The M.P.'s will no longer be necessary, they can return to their Electoral Districts and work with the Counties to serve people in need if they still desire.
9. The Canadian Embassies in the world can be used as hostels for traveling Canadians in need and the news media.
10. The nation's churches and mosques can be made available for the genuinely poor, hungry and homeless in each county.
11. The Peace Keepers (army, navy and air force) shall work with the R.C.M.P. to maintain peace and security of our nation; and continue peace-keeping activities in other parts of the planet, only under the umbrella of the United Nations and only at the behest of the Citizens of Canada.
12. My Fellow Citizens, if we ever hope to achieve world peace, population control, a free global market and economic democratic control by the citizens; the quality of life would improve for all ^Nour nation and on the planet. This can only be achieved by the adoption of the Universal Principle that 1) the citizens are the highest legislative body in Society, 2) that no legislative, judicial or socialist government bureaucratic institution exceeds the will of the Citizens in the affairs of county, state or nation, and 3) that the Citizen is the master of his or her own domain.

NECESSARY CHANGES IN THE PROVINCES

1. Dismiss the Bureaucracy at the top level of the Provincial Administrative Services (they are both unnecessary and destructive to the quality of the Province (State). Maintain the female staff and other workers.
2. Divide the Provincial Administrative Services between the Premier and the Elected Members of Parliament, who shall be responsible to the counties and the term Provincial (State) shall include the Territories and Native Indians and Metis.
3. An examination of various services will be required to determine the need for all the numerous services. i.e. Social Service Dept. will be closed down, since that responsibility will be taken over by each county.
4. It may be determined in time that many of the so-called services will be best served by the counties.

Like eggs, never put all your dollars in one basket.

NECESSARY CHANGES IN THE COUNTY

1. Dismiss the Bureaucracy at the top level of the County's Administrative Services. (They are both unnecessary and destructive to the quality of the County) Maintain the female staff and other workers.
2. Divide the County's Administrative Services between the Mayor and Elected Council Members, who shall be responsible to the citizens of the county. i.e. in the case of White Rock:
 - (a) General Government (Council, Clerk, Planning, Human Resources and Finance.
 - (b) Public works (Roads, sidewalks, Drainage, Garbage and Recycling etc)
 - (c) Leisure Services (Arena, Senior Centres etc)
 - (d) Library and Museum
 - (e) Permits and Licenses, inspection etc.
 - (f) Police and Fire Protection
 - (g) Court House and Judiciary
 - (h) Hospitals and Medical Services

NOTE: Since Counties will be taking over Item (h), there will be no need to obtain agreements with three levels of government. The citizens shall decide what is required in health care.
