# Virginia Hoover

### DESCRIPTION OF PRESENTATION

A presentation in support of MMP.

### **KEY THEMES**

The presenter discussed the apparent delusion of governments who introduce measures that are clearly against the wishes of the predominantly Christian electorate. Ms. Hoover argued that the current system induces strategic voting, as citizens tend to vote against incumbent governments rather than for a set of policy ideas.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

Ms. Hoover supported the introduction of MMP on the grounds of the belief that providing a party vote and a vote for an individual candidate would give voters a chance to indicate which policies they support.
