DESCRIPTION OF PRESENTATION

Brief oral presentation regarding my suggestion for changes to the electoral system.

KEY THEMES

Anne Grube argued that the electoral system needs to change because many voters feel that their vote never counts. She told the hearing that her son, who is very involved in social justice issues and politically active, is not intending to vote because he is so disenchanted with the political system. She criticized the lack of social diversity in the legislature and described most MLAs as well-off, white, middle-aged males of Western European heritage. Ms Grube argued that women and minorities would be better represented under a proportional representation electoral system. She supported the introduction of MMP to address the inequalities in British Columbia.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Anne Grube recommended the introduction of MMP in British Columbia.
