DESCRIPTION OF PRESENTATION

A presentation in support of MMP.

KEY THEMES

Mr. Rice discussed his experience as a canvasser for the Proportional Representation Initiative of 2002. The presenter shared with concern his observation of voter apathy among senior citizens on the bus.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Mr. Rice advocated the introduction of MMP on the grounds that it constitutes a fair means of representation for the people of BC. The presenter argued that the introduction of MMP would promote consensus politics in the legislature. Mr. Rice stated that while MMP may produce minority governments, this may be viewed as advantageous as it would promote compromise. Mr. Rice stated that changing the electoral system would be beneficial and need not result in detrimental changes to society.
