DESCRIPTION OF PRESENTATION

A presentation discussing the means of encouraging greater citizen involvement in the political process, particularly on the part of youth.

KEY THEMES

Mr. Zacharias stated the need to engage the citizenry in the political process via the reform of the electoral system, the recall process, and via a test for individuals holding public office.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Mr. Zacharias expressed support for a change to MMP in addition to reforming the recall process in BC. The presenter also recommended that every citizen in BC should have a card (akin to a credit card) that would allow them to vote. Finally, Mr. Zacharias recommended the introduction of a rebate on drivers' licenses in order to provide an incentive for citizens to vote.
