DESCRIPTION OF PRESENTATION

I always vote but as I enter middle age I realize that only once has someone I voted for actually been elected. I am beginning to feel that our democracy is a sham – we get a ballot but our vote doesn't give us a voice, it just legitimizes a terrible fraud.

KEY THEMES

Pat Christie spoke in support of the MMP electoral system, but added that she had heard good arguments at the hearing about giving more power to the individual voter and thought that other systems might be worth consideration. She argued that MMP seems acceptable to many because it appears that it may prevent some of the worst excesses of the FPP system and because young people seem interested and enthusiastic about MMP. Ms Christie also emphasized the need for the Assembly to ensure that whatever system they recommend does not further disenfranchise rural areas. She argued that ideas and attitudes have changed considerably over the last 100 years, and it is important for the electoral system to evolve also. Ms Christie argued that electoral system change is necessary to prevent further political disenchantment among voters.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Pat Christie recommended the introduction of MMP in British Columbia.

Quote: "I always vote, but I am becoming increasingly disenchanted with our present electoral democracy, as resulting policies and laws seem to benefit wealth and power at the expense of the many and the world itself."
