Submission on The Electoral System of British Columbia
by Portlandt J. G. Mackenzie of Vancouver.

The single member plurality voting system now in use in B.C. only works fairly when there are only two parties i.e. two choices, to vote on.

The recent past has produced three or more parties in elections. It seems evident that this trend will continue in the future.

I feel that the fairest, simplest and most desirable electoral system would be a mixed member proportional system. This would provide regional members and representation for all parties with votes above a threshold (say 5%)
