#### **DESCRIPTION OF PRESENTATION**

About supporting proportional representation.

#### **KEY THEMES**

Josephine Doman described her experience as a canvasser during the Proportional Representation Initiative in 2002. She told the hearing that as she had canvassed she had encountered a great deal of support for proportional representation. Ms Doman described the enthusiasm of the young people she met while canvassing, but explained that often young people were unable to sign the petition because they were not registered as voters due to their disillusionment with the government and their belief that their votes did not count. She recounted that some of the other people that she canvassed were concerned that too many small parties would be elected, while some people felt that local representation was very important. Ms Doman told the assembly that she supported the proposal for change made by the Free Your Vote Pro Rep Society.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

Josephine Doman supported the introduction of MMP in British Columbia, as proposed by the Free Your Vote Society.
